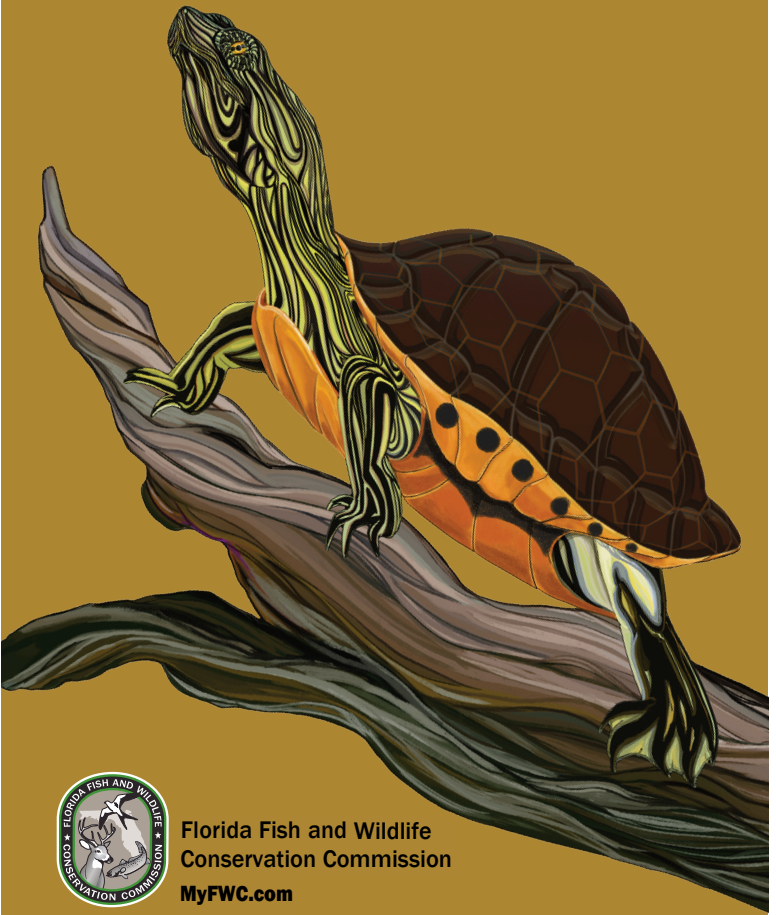

# CHECKLIST OF FLORIDA'S AMPHIBIANS AND REPTILES

## Introduction

Whether you're a professional herpetologist, an amateur naturalist, or simply someone with an interest in the fascinating world of amphibians and reptiles, this checklist provides a valuable reference for learning about the diverse fauna of Florida.

Florida is home to a wide range of amphibians and reptiles, including many species that are found nowhere else. From anoles that scurry across urban sidewalks to the secretive salamanders and snakes that inhabit the state's wetlands and forests, these animals play important ecological roles and capture the imagination of both residents and visitors alike.

As interest in these creatures grows, so does our understanding of their classification (taxonomy) and biology. This checklist of the amphibians and reptiles of Florida is up to date at the time of printing, but it is important to note that taxonomy is rapidly changing. Our understanding of Florida's species is evolving as genetic data become available, resulting in frequent changes that will be reflected in future editions of this checklist.

This guide includes many nonnative species found in the state. Nonnative species can compete with and spread diseases to native species, potentially cause harm to the environment, the economy, and/or human health and safety. If nonnative snakes, monitors, or tegus are observed, they should be reported to FWC's Invasive Species Hotline at 888-Ive-Got1 (483-4681). All other nonnative reptile and amphibian species can be reported via the IveGot1 app or *IveGot1.org*.

For those interested in delving deeper into the world of Florida's amphibians and reptiles, the definitive reference is the book *Amphibians and Reptiles of Florida* by Krysko, Enge, and Moler, published in 2019. This comprehensive volume provides detailed information on the taxonomy, distribution, ecology, and conservation of most species known to occur in the state. It is an invaluable resource for professionals, amateurs, and students alike.

The following abbreviations are placed after species names to identify species with legal protections or restrictions. A footnote (\*) is included when the status applies to only a portion of the population, either certain subspecies or certain locations.

FE – Federally Endangered

*Protected under the Endangered Species Act.*

FT – Federally Threatened

*Protected under the Endangered Species Act.*

ST – State Threatened

*Protected under Florida's Endangered and Threatened Species Act.*

R – Regulated Species

*There are restrictions on collection or possession of this species. Check MyFWC.com for current regulations.*
